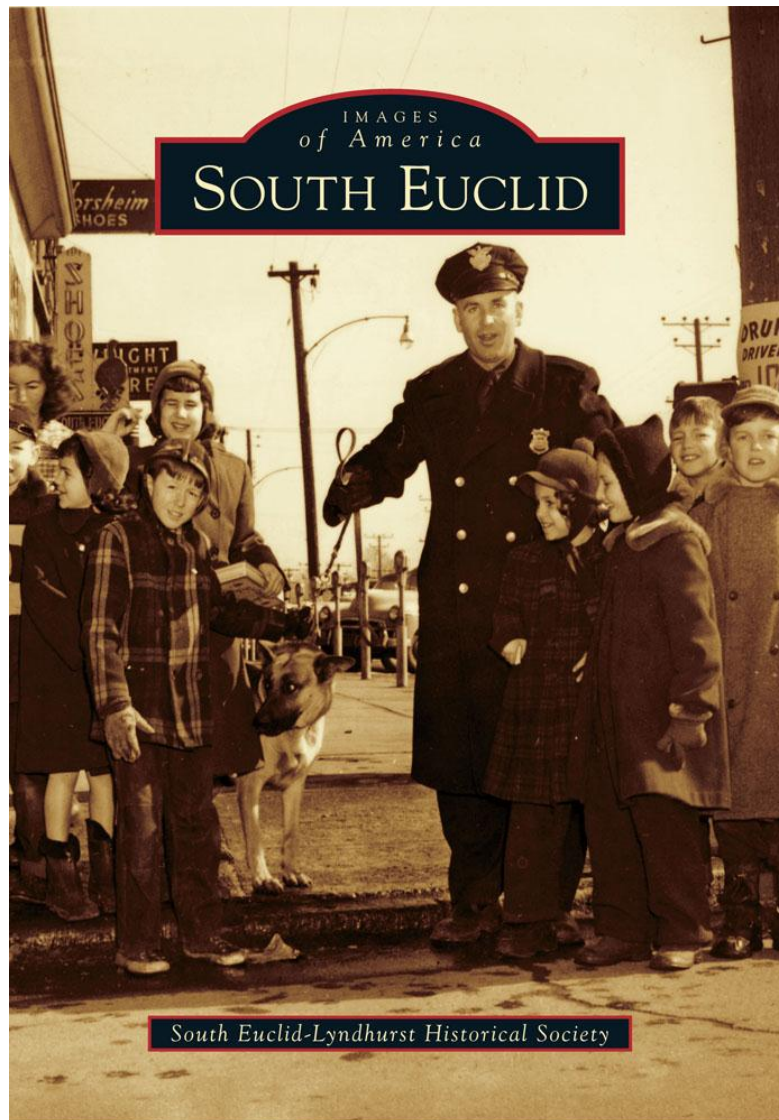

### SOUTH EUCLID RECYCLES!

**There's no need to wait for the next Recycling Roundup!**

South Euclid Residents may drop off any of the following items at the South Euclid Service Department Office at 4224 Monticello Blvd. between 8 am and 3 pm, Monday through Friday.

**The following items are accepted for recycling at the Service**

**Department:**

- Oil-based paint, wood stain, varnishes
- Aerosols (any aerosol cans < 20 oz., spray paint, pesticides, insecticides, herbicides)
- Flammable Liquids: gasoline, kerosene, lighter fluid, mineral spirits, acetone, xylene
- Pesticides: Bug or weed killer (solids or liquids)
- Acidic Cleaners: Corrosive liquids, Naval jelly, muriatic and sulfuric acids, toilet bowl cleaner
- Basic Cleaners: Corrosive liquids, sodium hydroxide, ammonia, Drano, caustic soda, 409 cleaner
- Antifreeze
- Motor Oil: Motor oil, lubricant, linseed oil, cooking oil/deep fryer oil
- Mercury: Thermometers, switches, elemental mercury (Hg)
- Batteries:
  - Nickel Cadmium batteries - Cordless drills, etc. (Ni-Cd)
  - Lithium batteries - Laptops, cell phones, etc. (Li, Li-ion)
  - Lead-acid batteries - Look for Pb on the battery
- Fluorescent Bulbs: 4 or 8 foot tubes (Take CFL's to Lowe's or Home Depot)
- Rigid Packing Styrofoam (no "peanuts" - Take Styrofoam meat and food trays to Heinen's)
- Yard Waste: branches, leaves, grass clippings
