Green Homes Bloom In South Euclid! *The Green Neighborhoods Initiative*



The City's first green home became a reality this Summer at 4182 Wilmington Road. The home is the first in a series of green bungalow retrofits that will be completed by the City of South Euclid as part of the Green Neighborhoods Initiative. The innovative green-building concept was created by the city in collaboration with City Architecture, Zaremba Home Again Restoration Company and students from the Cleveland Institute of Art.

The home at 4182 Wilmington Road, a former HUD property acquired for \$35,000, was reconfigured to create an open floor plan with a master suite, laundry and mud room on the first floor. The property was designed to accommodate owners in any life phase and allow for aging in place. Landscaping was redesigned to incorporate native plantings, pervious paver seating area and walkway, low-mow grass, rain barrels and a rain garden-features designed to lower

environmental impact and maintenance. LEED for Homes certification is pending for the project.

The Initiative utilizes nearly \$800,000 in combined competitive grant funds from the Federal Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) and the First Suburbs Development Council's Vacant Residential Property Fund. The City plans to acquire and remodel up to six additional homes. The second Green home is scheduled to be completed around the end of October.

By launching the Green Neighborhoods Initiative, the city intends to market itself as the first choice suburb for green living with the goal of showcasing the potential of the mid-century bungalow, and the advantages in living in an inner ring suburb with walkable neighborhoods and affordable, well made homes.

A College Town For All Ages!

Less than a decade ago, Notre Dame College was a small institution with around 300 full-time students and a very low profile. It had transitioned from female-only to coed just two years earlier. In 2003, Dr. Andrew Roth became President and with careful planning and measured growth Notre Dame College's enrollment exploded. Dr. Roth estimates that the private school's 2010 enrollment contains more than 1,200 full-time students, and almost 2,300 total students. The school spent \$20 million on upgrades including a remodeled library, state-of-the-art nursing lab and a new cafe. "Enrollment drives the institution," Dr. Roth explains. "It's really important that when students come to the school, that the school can provide them with the facilities that they need, that are up to date and modern."

The South Euclid-Lyndhurst City School District continued its trend of strong academics and steady improvement as the District maintained its State rating of "Effective" on the 2009-2010 Local Report Card for the tenth year.

"There is a great deal of encouraging news in these results," said SE-L Superintendent Dr. William Zelei. "Given the recent staff reductions and this time of significant fiscal constraints and budget reductions for everyone, we have been able to maintain a strong level of academic focus, and it shows in our results. Nevertheless, there remains a lot of work to do, and there are areas of concern in our results that require special attention."

"Our goal remains to increase our overall rating and to see improvements in every building," continued Dr. Zelei. "'Effective' is a good rating, but we won't rest until we attain the top rating of Excellent, as our community deserves. I am confident that with our current programs and personnel, and the implementation of additional programs, we will achieve that goal."
