An arson fire in the early-evening of Monday, November 1, 2010 destroyed the City's Playground of Possibilities, a community-built playground, which opened in Spring 2009. Over the past weeks, contractors and community volunteers have worked to re-build the playground for our community's children.

The Playground of Possibilities was designed by South Euclid children who participated in a series of "Design Day" events. The Playground is one of the first community-built, accessible playgrounds in Cleveland's inner-ring suburbs and serves all of our region's children (with or without) disabilities and is a place where children of all abilities can play together.

Community-Built playgrounds also serve an important social function by bringing residents together to work towards something positive for South Euclid and making our community a better place to live, work and play!
