The [White House Fellows program](#), one of the nation's most prestigious programs for leadership and public service, is currently accepting application from U.S. applicants and we need your help to get the word out to the alumni community! The White House Fellows program, founded by President Johnson in 1964, provides exceptional young men and women with first-hand experience working at the highest levels of the federal government. Fellows spend one year in Washington, D.C. working in the offices of Cabinet Secretaries, White House staff, and other high level Executive Branch officials. The Fellows Program is non-partisan, highly competitive and seeks people who have distinguished themselves through their work and dedication to public service.

Many of the Fellowship Program's alumni - including General Colin Powell, the Ambassador to El Salvador Mari Carmen Aponte, and historian/author Doris Kearns Goodwin - call the experience transformational. Also, many Fulbright Scholars have gone on to White House Fellowships.

In order to apply, applicants must be a U.S. citizen, have completed an undergraduate education and be working in their chosen profession.
