

AN ORDINANCE

AMENDING SECTION 351.14 "ALL-NIGHT PARKING PROHIBITED" OF CHAPTER 351 "PARKING GENERALLY" OF PART THREE "TRAFFIC CODE" OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SOUTH EUCLID, OHIO.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of South Euclid recognizes the importance of updating the traffic code to satisfy the needs of today's society; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to allow residents the option to park vehicles overnight on the street if their property does not meet certain minimum requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of South Euclid, Ohio:

Section 1: That Section 351.14 "All-Night Parking Prohibited" of Chapter 351 "Parking Generally" of Part Three "Traffic Code" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of South Euclid, Ohio be hereby amended to read as follows:

**351.14 ALL-NIGHT PARKING PROHIBITED.**

(a) No person shall park a vehicle on any street or highway in the City between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on any day, except bona-fide emergency vehicles and physicians on emergency house calls, or other persons who first have obtained a parking permit from the Police Department. Nothing herein contained shall limit the authority of the Director of Public Safety to further limit or entirely prohibit parking between such hours at places which he may from time to time designate and cause to be marked with appropriate signs.

(b) Upon application of any person to the Traffic Commissioner, a parking permit may be issued if in the opinion of the Traffic Commissioner, the issuance of such permit would be reasonably necessary for the applicant and community as a whole. Reasons for a permit include but are not limited to: not enough room in the driveway to accommodate the number of vehicles for that household. Such permit shall be available at a cost of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per tag and shall expire annually on December 31. The parking permit authorized herein shall be firmly affixed to and prominently displayed in the lower corner of the windshield on the driver's side of the authorized vehicle.

(c) The Traffic Commissioner is hereby authorized and directed to compile and maintain a record of permits issued and to compile regulations to act as a guide in the issuance of permits.

(d) Replacement of Permits.

(1) Lost or stolen permits: Lost or stolen permits may be replaced upon presentation for inspection of the permit vehicle to the Traffic Commissioner. A ten dollar (\$10.00) fee shall be charged for reissue.

(2) New vehicles: A replacement permit shall be issued upon payment of a ten dollar (\$10.00) fee if a vehicle that was properly issued a permit is disposed of, provided that the original permit, or sufficient portions thereof, is removed prior to disposing of the vehicle and presented to the Traffic Commissioner prior to issuance of a new permit. Failure to provide adequate proof of removal shall result in the charge of a prorated fee for the replacement permit.

(3) All other City ordinances, rules and regulations not specifically abrogated herein shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 2: That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees on or after November 25, 1975, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety and for further reason that the City must allow residents the option of parking vehicles overnight on the street if their property does not meet certain minimum standards. Wherefore, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law and upon signature of the Mayor.

A RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF APPROPRIATED FUNDS FROM  
THE "SAFETY FORCES LEVY FUND #410 (PERSONAL SERVICES)"  
TO THE "SAFETY FORCES LEVY FUND #410 (OTHER)."

WHEREAS, funds must be transferred within the Safety Forces Levy Fund in order to pay Auditor/Treasurer collection fees associated with the levy; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of South Euclid, Ohio acknowledges that the Ohio Revised Code requires a resolution when transferring money within a fund between the personal services category and any other category within that fund.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of South Euclid, Ohio:

Section 1: That the Council of the City of South Euclid hereby authorizes the Finance Director to transfer \$12,000.00 from the "Safety Forces Levy #410 (Personal Services)" to the "Safety Forces Levy #410 (Other)."

Section 2: That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees on or after November 25, 1975, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: Wherefore, this Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law and upon signature of the Mayor.
