AN ORDINANCE

APPROVING THE EDITING AND INCLUSION OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES AS PARTS OF THE VARIOUS COMPONENT CODES OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION AND PUBLICATION OF NEW MATTER IN THE UPDATED AND REVISED CODIFIED ORDINANCES; REPEALING ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation has completed its annual updating and revision of the Codified Ordinances of the City, and

WHEREAS, various ordinances of a general and permanent nature have been passed by Council since the date of the previous updating and revision of the Codified Ordinances and have been included in the Codified Ordinances of the City, and

WHEREAS, certain changes were made in the Codified Ordinances to bring City law into conformity with State law, now therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of South Euclid, Cuyahoga County, Ohio:

Section 1. ADOPTING ORDINANCE

Section 4. That pursuant to Article II, Section 5(d), of the City Charter, Ohio R.C. 731.23 and Section 113.05 of the Codified Ordinances, the Clerk of Council shall publish the number, title and date of passage of this ordinance, twice on the same day of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the City, and, further, shall post a certified copy of this ordinance, together with such summary, for at least fifteen days in a public place in the City Hall.

Section 5. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees on or after November 25, 1975, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Ohio R.C. Section 121.22.

Section 6. That this ordinance is deemed to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety and for the further reason that it will update the codification of the legislation of the City, consistent with the City Charter and with State law, where and as required by Article XVIII, Section 3, of the Ohio Constitution, with which to administer the affairs of the City, enforce law and order and avoid practical and legal entanglements. Wherefore, this Ordinance and the 2013 Replacement Pages for the Codified Ordinances hereby approved, adopted and enacted, shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law and upon signature of the Mayor.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to conduct an environmental assessment of the property at 480 South Green Road, Permanent Parcel Numbers 701-13-028, 701-13-029, 701-13-030, and 701-13-060 in the City of South Euclid, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, there is funding available for the assessment of the property through the Cuyahoga County Brownfield Redevelopment Fund Community Assessment Initiative; and

WHEREAS, 480 South Green Road, LLC desires to make application for a grant to fund the assessment of the property through the Cuyahoga County Brownfield Redevelopment Fund Community Assessment Initiative; and

WHEREAS, 480 South Green Road, LLC will create four (4) jobs in the City of South Euclid as part of an expansion project for the company Revived Housing, LLC which will be the primary tenant, additional jobs may be created through other tenants leasing the remainder of the building upon completion; and

WHEREAS, between acquisition and construction, 480 South Green Road, LLC will invest \$95,000.00 at 480 South Green Road; and

Section 7: That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees on or after November 25, 1975, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
